



The Highland Historical Society

Author, Educator and Highland Resident,

Peggy will discuss old school textbooks. She has taught for more than 20 years and has seen firsthand the changes in how information is presented to students (from 5-inch floppy discs as the "new" technology to the use of smartphones).

Peggy will cover how textbooks evolved from Colonial times to the present. The use of The New England Primer (1690), a beginning reader with religious and moral lessons, evolved to American Noah Webster's reader for students, *American Spelling Book* (1783), and later his dictionaries stressing the American Language to reflect a new nation. The next most famous book is McGuffey readers (1836), used for more than a century in American schools.

Early history books reflected the mother country, not reality. Before the Civil War, most textbooks were published in the north and questioned the southern institution of slavery, which many in the south objected to as misguided attacks on their culture and state's rights. A growing Catholic population desired history books that were less steeped in Protestantism of the writers and began printing their own books in the late 1800's for parochial schools. By 1911, "An American History" by David Muzzey became the standard text, dominating history teaching until the1950's. In the 60's his book was scorned for racism and paternalism.

A science book provoked perhaps the most well-known American textbook dispute in 1925. Tennessee high school teacher, John T. Scopes, was arrested for violating state law by teaching evolution—from a state-approved biology text. For the majority of American history, textbooks dominated our education system, but technological advances have changed the way people interact with books via digital materials, online tutoring and video lecturing. Peggy will also have various old textbooks to show us.
