



There will be an optional and informal networking session starting at 10:00 am after the presentation concludes. Here you can ask questions specific to your business and brainstorm ideas with other attendees.



Local Consumers Can Call to Scrap a Car Metro Recycling offers new pick-up service

[Griffith, Indiana, February 1, 2018—] Metro Recycling has launched a scrap vehicle pick-up service for owners who are ready to get rid of a junk car, announced CEO Neil Samahon today.

This new customer service provides the opportunity for consumers to remove unwanted vehicles without the hassle and safety risks of transporting a vehicle to recycling facilities, he said.
