Adam Gawlikowski

A self taught guitar player and vocalist, Adam performs traditional and classic folk songs made popular by a wide variety of noted recording artists. His repertory is taken from artists such as Woody Guthrie, Tom Paxton, The Kingston Trio, Bob Dylan, Peter, Paul and Mary, John Denver, plus a wide variety of traditional material. His concerts also introduce audiences to a mix of Broadway show tunes and 'Sing-A-Long' songs from the '50s.

In 2016, Adam was selected to perform at Star Plaza Theatre as part of a 'Supergroup' to backup the national vocal group *Under the Streetlamp* in a program entitled 'Harmonies for Healing' which was broadcast in a two-part series on PBS television in 2017.



David Herr

David is a graduate of Andean High School and Wabash College. He received his Masters in Public Affairs from Indiana University Northwest. David is currently the Music Director at St. Irenaeus Catholic Church in Park Forest, IL, in the Archdiocese of Chicago. In addition, He has been the Choir Director at Bishop Noll Institute since 2012, and the Vocal Coach/ Music Director for Bishop Noll's Spring Musicals. David is also the Executive Secretary to the Diocese of Gary Office of Worship, where he prepares and coordinates the Diocesan Liturgies with Bishop Hying, He also conducts the Diocesan Choir, and helps provide Training and Renewal to Lay Liturgical Ministers in the Diocese of Gary.



Mark Frederick

Mark began his musical life with his family's gospel band, which toured the Midwest throughout the early '70's. He and his wife Cathy moved to Los Angeles where he wrote songs and played guitar and bass. He became involved in composing soundtracks for up-and-coming artists. In 1982 he was asked to compose the music for a Lockheed Corp. film on the history of the U-2 spy plane. That film with Mark's music resides in the Smithsonian Air and Space museum in Washington D.C. Mark has a B.S. in Music Ed from California State and his M.S. in Music Tech from IU. Now retired, Mark plays bass for the popular '50's groups - the Platters, the Coasters and the Drifters. He is happy to be playing once again with his music mentor from high school, Adam Gawlikowski!

An alumnus of Indiana University and The Catholic University of America, singer-songwriter Nicholas is a Board Certified Catholic Chaplain with Franciscan Alliance. 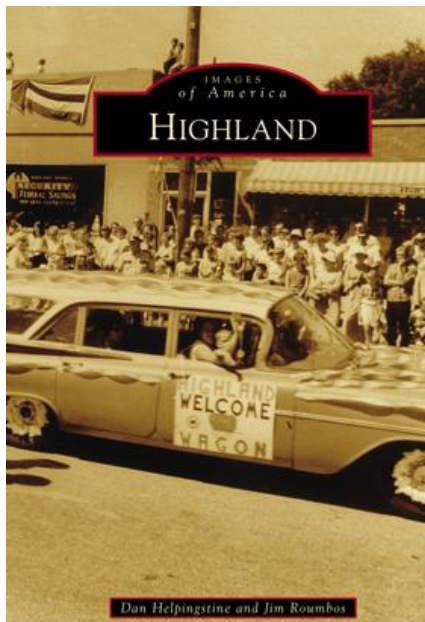
