Kent Dickinson

Kent Dickinson is the son of Ken and Irene Dickinson, original owners of The Town Theatre. Kent was raised in Highland and attended Our Lady of Grace School, is a Highland High graduate, class of 1968 and attended IU Northwest.

Instead of joining the family business, Kent joined the Chicago Projectionist Union Local 110.

When a multi-national business threatened to bring down the union, Kent joined the picket line.

When the legal activity of picketing didn't work, he stepped into a darker world. Believing he was fighting for a just cause, he began to commit acts of vandalism, which is not a unique union tactic.

Soon Kent was setting off chemical smoke bombs in theaters around the country and became powerful in Chicago's most mob-dominated union, which has ties back to Al Capone. Kent began to hate who he had become. The values of his youth and his faith were re-awakened and he began to walk away from what he saw as wrong. Already targeted by an FBI investigation, Kent was arrested two years after his last crime. He was indicted on 15 counts of arson and conspiracy, and accepted a plea deal. He served 33 months in federal prison. During his stay, he embraced the values of his upbringing and found the strength to turn prison into a learning experience. Kent currently works for the Salvation Army, teaches Sunday school and speaks to groups about his crimes and redemption.


Kent Dickinson is the author of "Crimes of a Christian, Serving Two Masters."

Published in 2011, it covers his life and story in the Projectionists Local 110 and his indictment and federal prison sentence. **The book is currently out of print and not available due to the publisher going out of business.** He is trying to get another publisher to reprint.

Kent would like to share his life story with us and talk about his years growing up in Highland, his parent's business, The Town Theatre and his union days, indictment and sentence.


